

Year 10 Mathematics Experience Program

UniSA selects two Year 10 students who have shown aptitude and talent in Mathematics to participate in the Year 10 UniSA Mathematics Experience Program. The full day program, a UniSA Connect Program in collaboration with the School of Information Technology and Mathematical Sciences, is designed to reward talented and enthusiastic Maths students who have shown an interest in pursuing a mathematically based career. The program:

- engages students in an experimental program delivered by academic staff from the School of Information Technology and Mathematical Sciences
- encourages students to develop relationships with like-minded students from other secondary schools
- assists students to develop an understanding of mathematical applications
- provides career information about mathematically based careers.

STEM Scholarships

Year: 11 and 12 (SACE Stage 1 and 2 level)

A \$1 million scholarship fund has been created to support 110 high school students from underrepresented groups, low SES, females and Aboriginal learners to pursue Science, Technology and Mathematics (STEM) subjects at SACE Stage 1 and 2 level.

The scholarships will support students to achieve their best possible ATAR through targeted financial support to pursue STEM subjects and pathways. The fund will cover the cost of tutors, laptops, excursions or any other strategy that directly supports the student to achieve in their chosen STEM subjects and pathways. To receive the scholarship, the students must demonstrate continued enrolment and achievement in STEM subjects for SACE Stage 1 and 2, and attend at least 90% of scheduled lessons. Students are also expected to participate in activities that support career awareness in STEM and dispositions for STEM learning.



Australian Mathematics Competition

The Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) was introduced in Australia in 1978 as the first Australia-wide Mathematics Competition for students. The AMC is for students of all standards. Students are asked to solve 30 problems in 75 minutes. The problems are designed to test mathematical thinking and questions are designed so that they can be answered just as quickly without a calculator as with one. The problems get more difficult through the competition, so at the end they are challenging to the most gifted students. Students of all standards will make progress through the problems and be challenged along the way.

Australian Intermediate Mathematics Olympiad (AIMO)

This four-hour examination is an open event for talented students up to Year 10 level, appropriate for those who have completed the Gauss or Noether stage, high achievers in the Australian Mathematics Compeition and students who have acquired knowledge of Olympiad problem solving. The AIMO is one of the competitions used to determine which students are selected to a number of invitiation only events, including other Mathematics competitions, enrichment classes and training schools. It gives talented students an opportunity to be recognised and to participate in activities which enhance their enjoyment and knowledge of Mathematics.

Chemistry and Specialist Mathematics Help

The Science and Engineering Challenge is a national competition and a chance to put your scientific and mathematical thinking to the test, with a number of hands on engineering challenges to be carried out in small groups with limited materials and time constraints. Examples of challenge activities include: building a bridge out of lightweight materials to hold a static and dynamic load of more than 1kg, making a mechanical hand out of straws and string so that it can pick up objects and do sign language and designing and building a catapult, to name a few of the exciting challenges on offer. If you are good at working in a team, can 'think outside box' and thrive under pressure then this is the team for you!
